Additional Safety Precautions for Operating a PBB

- 1. Ensure that the area is clear of personnel and equipment prior to operating the PBB
- 2. Wait for engine spool-down to begin before approaching the aircraft
- 3. When docking, be careful not to damage antennas, pilot tubes and stall-warning devices on the aircraft
- 4. Stop the PBB about 1.5 inches from the aircraft door
- 5. Be sure to place the safety shoe under the aircraft door
- 6. Do not use the PBB service stairs when the PBB is moving
- 7. Never run on the PBB service stairs
- 8. Keep at least one hand on the handrail when using the PBB service stairs
- 9. Close safety straps or rolling/sliding doors before retracting the PBB from the aircraft
- 10. Place the safety shoe in its holder when not in use
- 11. Press the Emergency Button (E-Stop) if a loss of PBB control occurs, and remove the key from the switch
- 12. Conduct periodic auto-leveler checks to ensure that the PBB rises and settles with the aircraft
